## REB SHLOMO CARLEBACH TIMELINE

1917 Naphtali son of Rabbi Dr. Shlomo (Salomon) Carlebach, rabbi of Lübeck, marries Pessia, daughter of Rabbi Asher Cohn, Chief Rabbi of Basel. Naphtali becomes rabbi of Pestalozzistraße Synagogue in Berlin.

**1925** Shlomo and Eli Chaim twins born in Berlin. **1931** Inauguration of Rabbi Naphtali as Chief Rabbi of Baden.

**1931–1937** Bobover and Tschortkover Hasidic tunes.

1937 Dec. 25, Twins' bar mitzvah. 1938 Lithuania. Telshe Yeshiva.

**1939** Rabbi Naphtali arrives in New York Feb. 9. Rest of the Carlebach family arrives March 23. **1939** Williamsburg, Brooklyn. R. Naphtali rabbi of Young Israel of Eastern Parkway.

1939-1943 Torah Vodaas.

1943-1949 Lakewood Yeshiva.

**1945** Rabbi Naphtali rabbi of Congregation Kehilath Jacob 305 West End Ave. 79th St. **1949** Heart condition of R. Naphtali worsens. Shlomo leaves Lakewood and receives mission from 6th Chabad Rebbe, RaYaTZ.

1950 Jan. 28, RaYaTZ dies. R. Menachem Mendel sends Shlomo to gain recruits for Lubavitch. Shlomo studies Hebrew in ulpan at JTS.
1951 Learns English at Columbia University.

1950-1955 Shlomo, "right-hand man" of the Chabad Rebbe. Works in a small synagogue in Harlem, teaches in yeshivot.

1954 Ordination from Rabbi Yitzhak Hutner. 1955 Leaves Chabad.

1955-1956 Advises The Dybbuk in Greenwich Village. Learns guitar with Anita Sheer who discovers his talent and transcribes his songs. 1955-1959: Philosophy and abnormal psychology at Columbia University and New School for Social Research in Greenwich Village. 1956-1957 Weekend Rabbi, Dorothy, New Jersey. 1957 Begins recording songs towards a record.

1958 Youth director, Congregation Tpheris Israel, St. Louis, Missouri (Oct. 1958-June 1959). 1959 First LP, Songs of My Soul.

First trip to Israel.

1960 Second LP, Sing My Heart.

1961 Visits Belgium, Holland, England, France.

1963 Third LP, At the Village Gate.

**1964** Eighth visit to Israel.

**1965** Fourth LP, In the Palace of the King. Fifth LP, Wake Up World.

Six European odysseys from Rotterdam to Buenos Aires, Sydney to Rome.

Student Struggle to Save Soviet Jewry. "Am Yisrael Chai," becomes anthem.

1966 9th Berkeley Folk Music Festival.

1967 Haight-Ashbury, San Francisco.

**1967** Dec. 23, Rabbi Naphtali Carlebach dies. Shlomo becomes rabbi of Kehilath Jacob. **1968** House of Love and Prayer (HLP) on 347 Arguello Blvd.

Moscow for Simchat Torah.

1971 1st HLP closes.

1972 Dec. 26, marriage to Neila.

1976 Founding of Moshav Me'or Modi'im.

1978 Closure of 2nd HLP.

1980 Death of Rebbetzin Pessia Carlebach.

1981 Production of the last LP, L'Kovid Shabbas.

1983 Jan. Festival of Hope in Germany.

**1989** Jan. 1-10 Warsaw, Cracow, Majdaneck, Biala, and Lodz.

Sept. 7-27 Leningrad, Kiev, Vilnius, Moscow.

**1994** Oct. 11-18 Last concert tour, England. Oct. 20 Fatal heart attack in LaGuardia Airport.

Oct. 23 Eulogies outside Carlebach Shul.

Oct. 24 Burial in Har HaMenuhot, Jerusalem.
